Thank you for your continued support of your AAFP Foundation and its initiatives and programs.

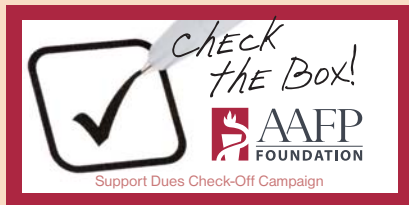

A Heart for Children


The 2009 Physicians With Heart (PWH) Airlift to the Republic of Georgia was another great success. The Children's Project was able to bring relief to two schools and two orphanages, as well as assist area internally displaced persons (IDPs).

Specifically, at the Saguramo Orphanage in Gori, the Children's Project was able to provide much needed quilts, blankets, sheets, and mattresses to keep the children warm throughout the bitterly cold winters, as well as sports equipment and hygiene kits. The most significant assistance that the Children's Project provided was at the Tbilisi Child Care Institute, where an entire block of sleeping rooms and bathrooms for 20 children was repaired. There are approximately 60 orphaned children that live at this facility.


The final two schools that received assistance from the Children's Project were in Gori; Gori Kindergarten and Gori Sports School. The heating system at the Gori Sports School was replaced, in addition to the bathrooms being repaired. The Children's Project also provided soccer balls and other sports equipment, and hygiene kits. The Saguramo Orphanage, Gori Sports School and Tbilisi Child Care Institute received hand-



made hats and mittens, along with enough multi-vitamins for each child for one year.

New this year, children from local schools in Kansas sent their greetings to the children in Georgia with personal letters, drawings, and photos — connecting children half a world apart. Each year, because of contributions like yours, the Children's Project has been able to touch the lives of countless children in war-torn Georgia. Thank you! This free, communication skill-building tool for patients and health care professionals features more than 550 videos that demonstrate methods to help make the most of the limited time in a medical visit. The program also features patient and health care professional educational brochures.
