

Resident/Early Career Physician Scholarship

Trip Date: February 10 – 17, 2024 Location: Dominican Republic

Application due date: August 31, 2023 Awards will be announced: September 30, 2023.

Requirements:

- Candidates should be a PGY2 or PGY3 Family Medicine Resident or early career physician (within 2 years of residency or Fellowship) and in good AAFP membership standing at the time of the application deadline.
- 2. Candidates must provide a compelling letter of intent (LOI). This letter may be shared with the sponsoring donor or organization if chosen.
 - <u>Residents</u>: LOI should address what the scholarship would do for their interest in global health and/or the impact on their education.
 - <u>Early career physicians</u>: LOI should address what the scholarship would do for their personal wellness and for their community.
- 3. Candidates that apply as a resident, must submit a letter from their program director stating their support of the trip and the impact the resident will make if chosen.
- 4. Candidates applying as an early career physician are to provide a letter of recommendation from a colleague or current employer.
- 5. Candidates should demonstrate an interest in international Family Medicine, international travel and/or involvement in humanitarian initiatives.
- 6. Candidates should be able to provide patient care in community clinics. If a resident, candidate will be placed under the direct supervision of another member of the Patient Care Team as his/her preceptor.
- 7. Candidates should have good communication/writing skills, as demonstrated in his/her cover letter.
- 8. Candidates should have demonstrated leadership skills.
- 9. Candidates should not have any disabilities that would preclude him/her from travel or heavy lifting or be dependent on others.
- 10. Candidates must be eligible to present during the AAFP's National Conference for Family Medicine Residents and Medical Students (July 2024) or other appropriate venue (i.e., FMX Global Health Summit)
- 11. Selected applicants must write a thank you note post trip to their sponsoring donor/organization.
- 12. All required documents must be received by the application deadline.
 - a. Completed electronic FMCI Scholarship Application
 - b. Letter of Intent (as described above)
 - c. Letter of support as described above.
 - d. A copy of your CV (resume)

Be prepared to provide if selected:

- a. A copy of your current medical license
- e. A copy of your medical degree
- f. A copy of your CV (resume)
- g. A copy of your DEA certificate
- h. A color copy of your Photo ID (Driver's License)
- i. A color copy of your Passport (must be dated 6 months past the date of return from deployment).

Selection Process:

The selection process will consist of the following actions:

- 1. The candidates will be submitted to the FMCI Scholarship Selection Committee for final selection, based on criteria.
- 2. Each application will be reviewed by a minimum of three reviewers per application.
- 3. Reviewer will notify the FMCI program manager and recuse themselves if the resident or early physician is a person they know.
- 4. Materials reviewed: General volunteer and supplemental scholarship application, CV, personal statement (LOI), and letters of support.

Scholarship Requirement:

- 1. Person is a resident physician or within 2 years of residency or fellowship.
- 2. Demonstrated Leadership
- 3. Demonstrated Global Health Interest
- 4. Demonstrated communication skills
- 5. Available to present at 2024 AAFP National Conference (July 31 August 3, 2024) or other appropriate venue.
